Dennis Lee Harris, age 74, of Waynesville, Missouri, went to be with the Lord on Monday morning, November 3, 2025. He was born on October 2, 1951, in his West Plains Missouri home, to Kenneth and Dessie Harris. Dennis lived a life marked by quiet strength, generosity, and deep devotion to his wife of 51 years, Sharon, his family, and his friends.

He graduated school from the College of the Ozarks, and while working during his school years there, an encounter with Sam Walton changed the course of his life and set him on a career path with Walmart. 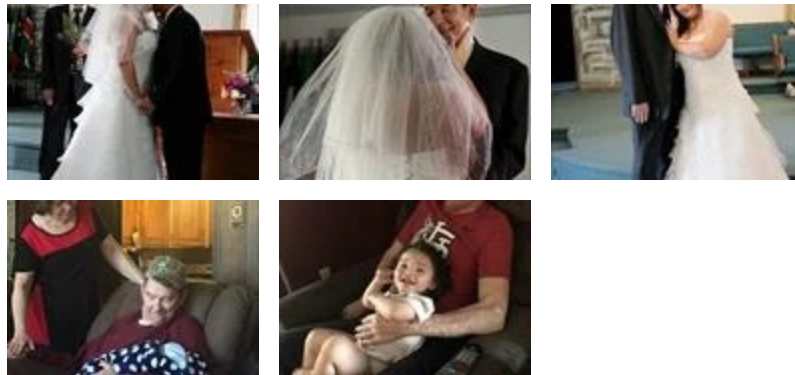

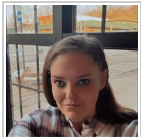
