Dixie Lee Banks, daughter of the late George W. Miller and Winnifred (McKinney) Miller, was born October 10, 1938 in Arlington, Missouri. As a young girl, Dixie grew up in Hooker, Missouri and graduated from Waynesville High School with the Class of 1956.

On October 17, 1959, Dixie was united in marriage to Don A. Banks in Vista, San Diego County, California. They shared three children Bill, Chris, and Michael and many wonderful memories before Don preceded Dixie in death.

Early in her working years, Dixie worked as a rodeo barrel racer/horse rider before she entered the United States Marine Corps. She served her country faithfully until her honorable discharge.

After her discharge from the military, Dixie worked as an elementary school nurse, American Red Cross Disaster Relief Specialist and a Pulaski County Reserve Deputy. She had a servant's heart and enjoyed helping anyone that she could.

Dixie was a lifetime member of the DAV (Disabled American Veterans), REACT (Radio Emergency Associated Communication Team) and Mark Twain Chapter President.

In her spare time, Dixie enjoyed sewing and was an avid St. Louis Cardinals baseball fan. But the one thing that gave her the most pleasure was working with horses and riding. She was interested in anything she could find on cowboys.

Dixie loved her family tremendously and enjoyed spending time with them whenever she could, especially the grandchildren.

Dixie passed away Monday, March 11, 2024 in the Phelps Health Hospital of Rolla, Missouri having attained the age of 85 years. She will be sadly missed, but fondly remembered by all those that knew and loved her.
