



SGM (Ret) Joe Richard Garner

May 6, 1934 - December 5, 2013

SGM (Ret) Joe Richard Garner, son of the late Orlan and Susie (Wells) Garner, was born May 6, 1934 in Sherwood, Tennessee. Joe grew up in Chattanooga and entered the United States Army at the age of 17.

Joe proudly served his country for 27 years of which 21 of those years was spent as a green beret. For his faithful service, Joe earned several awards and commendations and retired as a Sergeant Major on June 30, 1978.

On October 22, 1957, Joe was united in marriage to Kathleen Williams in Waynesville, Missouri. They shared over 56 years of marriage together and were blessed with two children: Valerie and Joe, Jr.

After retiring from the military, Joe spent 11 years working for Howards Construction helping to build bridges.

In his spare time, Joe loved hunting and fishing and in his younger years, he loved to skydive. Joe used to say he just loved being alive and enjoyed everything, including hard work. For many years, Joe enjoyed bass fishing tournaments and he liked to win. While in the Army, he liked sport parachute competitions. He also enjoyed handball, football and baseball.

Joe passed away Thursday, December 5, 2013 in his home in his beloved

Colley Holler surrounded by his family. He had attained the age of 79 years. He will be sadly missed by all those that knew and loved him.

Joe leaves to cherish his memory, his wife: Kathleen Garner of Waynesville, MO; two children: Valerie and Joe R. Garner, both of Waynesville, MO; one grandson: Jamie Lee Garner and wife Angie of Waynesville, MO; three great grandchildren: Jeremiah, Nevaeh and Riley Garner; six siblings: Lewis Garner of St. Louis, MO, Sally Peters and husband Carlos of Chattanooga, TN, Roger Garner of Chattanooga, TN, Jerry Garner of St. Simmons Island, GA, Larry Garner of Chattanooga, TN and Alan Garner of Atlanta, GA; special uncle: Ken Garner of Chattanooga, TN; several nieces, nephews, other relatives and friends.

“ To the family of Joe Garner:

I was sad when my brother David sent me the obituary of Joe. My father Pete went fishing with Joe often in Fort Gulick. My mother Cleo talked about Kathy Garner of Waynesville, as if she was her best friend. My mother was an immigrant from Mexico, my father a 7th generation Mexican American from San Antonio, Texas. Fifty years ago in Fort Gulick, two White southerners treated my father and mother as brother and sister. I guess that is what noble Americans from the heartland do, and they did it well.

My father Pete died in 1973 just a few years after we left Fort Gulick. In addition to treating my father with dignity, Joe was my hero. I remember one Memorial Day when Joe jumped out of an airplane skydiving, and landed his parachute right on target. I thought Joe could do no wrong, and for years as a child, I fantasized about being a skydiver. Of course, that was before I realized I was afraid of heights. Gulick also left me with a fear of snakes, sharks and wild animals.

I visited Fort Gulick in October 2012 which was fifty years after we first arrived in Panama. I took pictures of where we lived, but am sad to report that Gulick has been destroyed. The memories of kindness, brotherhood and bravery of good people like the Garners helped mold me into the person I am today.

Until reading Joe's obituary, I always thought Joe's last name was Gardner. I guess because of my mother's accent, we were remembering wrong, but we will never forget all the goodness that Joe and Kathy shared with my parents fifty years ago in a faraway dangerous place.
