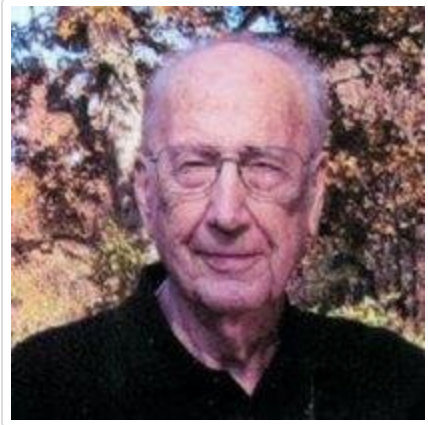




MSG (Ret) Don E. Jackson

“ This is my grandfather that I was lucky enough to have for 30 years. Unfortunately I can't be there this week to say good bye in person. I am so sad about that...that I can't be there with my family during this time. I am intensely sad that I was not there for his passing. I was thinking of him every single day and always sending my love. I know that is not enough from so far away, but I was always sending him and Grandma my love. But I do not want this message to be just about how sad we all are that he is gone. I want to take these moments to remember just a few of the happy times I had with him, appreciate all the things that he has done for me, and recognize the ways he has enriched my life.

He took me on summer vacations out West with Grandma that seemed like the coolest epic odysseys as we explored the country together. We went through mountain ranges (and he would jokingly ask me if we should just drive off the side of the mountain to save on gas!), found obscure western town nestled in the middle of nowhere (Silverton CO), explored cheesy tourist traps and super interesterst historical sites. We got stuck together in a cable car at Royal Gorge and saw walls of rock encrusted with dinosaur bones in Utah. We saw moose and buffalo and Old Faithful at Yellowstone. He let me "navigate" on the maps and pick out the hotels with swimming pools and walk the doggies at every rest stop.

He taught me to drive in his El Camino and took me for my driver's license test, which at the time seemed like the most nerve wracking test...EVER. I'm pretty sure parallel parking that El Camino was harder than some classes I took in college! He was so proud of me when I passed! He helped me find my first car. He sat through endless hours of dance recitals and colorguard competitions just to see me perform for a few minutes at a time. He even wore his Boston Crusaders hat all the time, even when I "retired" from performing.

He loved his animals and they loved him. Wherever he was sitting, the kitty or one of the doggies found him and happily cuddled with

him. He and Grandma have always had dogs and one of my favorite parts of visiting them was seeing their little doggies.

He was a tough old guy with a million stories about his military travels. On my last visit to see him, the highlight of the trip for me was talking to him and Grandma about all their adventures in Europe. Once, when Grandma didn't have the correct paperwork to get into where they were going, they conspired with their travelling group to "smuggle" her in by placing her in the middle of the crowd! He has been to so many places and served our country for so long in the military. I wish I would have written down every story he ever told me so I could compile them all into a book.

I know he wasn't perfect and he definitely had his stubborn and grouchy moments, as we all do, but for me he was just about the most perfect grandfather I could have asked for. He always loved me and made me feel like he was proud of me no matter what I was doing. I have so many happy memories with him and I will always treasure them.
